All educators across Ontario will receive accessibility awareness training in order to support the creation of inclusive environments and increase learning opportunities for students with disabilities.

This training is a continuation of the legislative requirements outlined in the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 (AODA). The Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation (IASR) is part of the AODA. It outlines rules that businesses and organizations in Ontario must follow to identify, remove and prevent barriers in order to have an accessible Ontario by 2025. This training is part of the Information and Communications Standard of the IASR.
