English	Encourage your child to watch as a parent or older sibling makes a meal. Have your child draw a picture or write a simple sentence telling what to do in each step. Your child can retell the steps to a family member in person or online. Use your child's procedure to make the recipe.	Take blank paper and crayons outside. Have your child find five different textures of which to make crayon rubbings. Use the rubbings to make a collage. Have your child tell you, or someone else, about the collage.	During, or just after, your child's favorite TV show, movie or video, ask them what makes it their favourite? Who else might like it? Why do they think that person might like it? Challenge them to make a poster to convince a sibling, or another family member, to watch it with them. Resources: Gumboot Kids on Curio.ca	Brainstorm with your child tasks that they could help you with around the house or in the yard during the next week. Have them create a to-do list for you both to follow. Encourage words or pictures in their very own to-do chart!	Have your child choose their favourite book to read. Encourage them to use the pictures to read the story to you, another family member or to a grandparent via technology. Ask your child to draw a picture of their favourite part of the book. French as a Second Language	Listen and read the mathologie book called <u>"Un Beau Nid"</u> and then play the online activity for each.	Watch the 1 minute video about parka. Prompts for discussion: - Name all of the colours in French that you see in the video Summarize what the episode is about (in pictures and/or words based on age and ability) - What is Parka searching to find for the snowman?	Listen and read the mathologie book called "Beaucoup de Points" and then play the online activity for each.	Brainstorm with your child tasks that they could help you with around the house in the next week. Have them create a French to-do list for you both to follow. Encourage words and/or pictures in their very own to-do chart!	Your child can make "Memory Game" cards using a French word and a picture (colours for instance — choose a theme for your child's level to help build French vocabulary). Once the cards are done, play the memory game. Optional Add-On: Your child can review numbers in French today by playing a card game of "Go Fish."
