Cheryl's goal is to prevent this tragedy from happening to other families. Through sharing her story, she hopes to make people think twice before drinking and driving and from getting into a vehicle when the driver has been drinking.

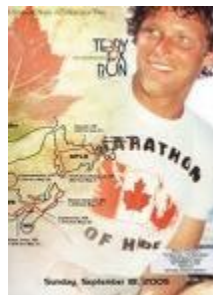
ART NEWS:

Fred Fox Assembly

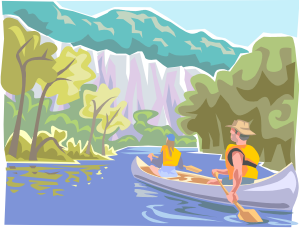

Outdoor Education Activities

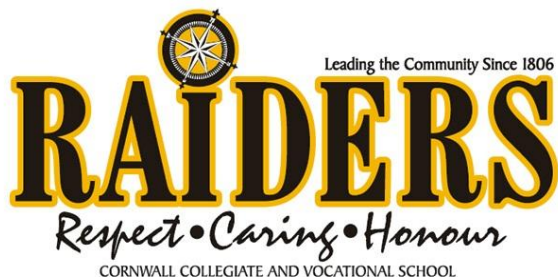


Our outdoor education class along with their teacher Mr. Carr will be taking a bike and canoe trip to Farran Park on May 17th & 18th. Later this month,
