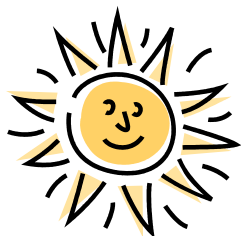

Finally, I would like to express my appreciation to you for your support throughout the year. I look forward to continuing as the Principal at North Dundas.

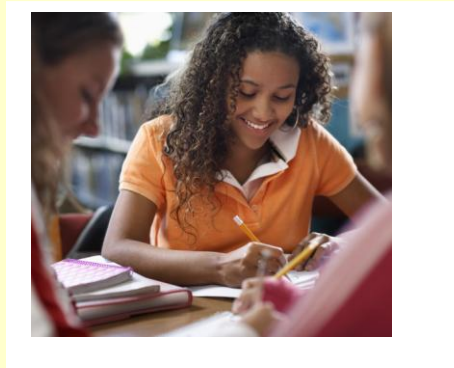

Guidance News



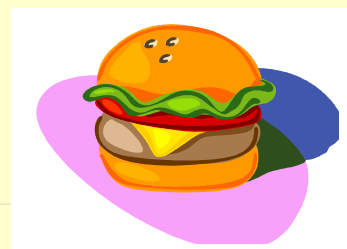

Orientation Barbeque

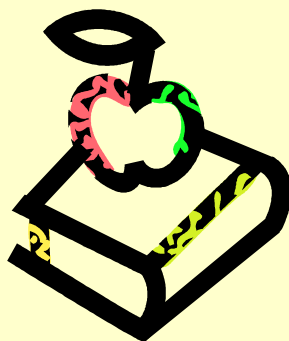
