



How to Pre-Register for Grades 7-12 at Brockville Collegiate Institute and Thousand Islands Secondary School

December 1st, 2011

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Since the conclusion of the 2007-08 Boundary 2020 Review, many schools across the Upper Canada District School Board have introduced grades 7-12 structures to improve the educational opportunities available to our students. Brockville CI and Thousand Islands SS will become grades 7-12 schools effective September 2012.

As the parent/guardian of a student from a Brockville feeder school, I would like to take this opportunity to encourage you to pre-register your child for either BCI or TISS for September 2012. You can do this by completing a brief on-line survey that is available at the following web-site: <http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/BCI-TISS>. Through pre-registration, you can help BCI and TISS prepare for next September and create welcoming environments for their new grades 7-8 students.

Your pre-registration simply provides the schools with an early understanding of the number of students that could be expected for next year. In some situations parents are still undecided as to which school their child will attend. Please note that there will be opportunities throughout the remainder of the school year for parents and students to visit any of our grades 7-12 schools, beginning with two open house events: January 10th at 6:30 for TISS (cafeteria), and January 11th at 6:00 for BCI (cafeteria).
