English	Easter Monday	Read or listen to a poem with your child. As you read, use expression and encourage your child to join you in familiar parts. Have your child act out a line, or the whole poem. Dress up and be creative! Record to share with family members. Click here to find poems:	Scroll through your device's photo stream or choose a photograph from around the house. Ask your child to tell the story of what happened in the photo (retell the event). They might draw a picture of what happened just before the photo was taken and what happened just after.	Your child might look through family cookbooks or online recipes (click here or click here). Encourage your child to choose a recipe which they would like to make. Ask your child to persuade you, by giving three reasons, either using words or in writing, why they should be allowed to make this recipe.	Your child might watch an online weather report. 

FSL – Wednesday Activities

FSL – Thursday Activities

Before reading: read the title and discuss the cover.

Ask your child what they think the story will be about.

- Why are these children happy?
- Is there another reason?

During the story, your child can:

- Identify the number of players on each team.
- Answer the fraction problems in the speech bubbles.
- Offer comments and ask questions based on hockey facts.
- Ask if they can predict what will happen at the end of the story.

After reading ask your child:

- Who are the main characters in the story?
- Where did the story take place?
- What was the problem in the story?
- What was your favourite part about the story?
- Do the online activity that follows the story.
